

Thoughts on the Election

Gary Woronchak - galexw@aol.com: I was asked to provide some thoughts here in advance of an election that I assume we all will be happy to have behind us. (Asked by the EFHS'73 newsltr writer, Laura Hice)

"My life has given me a unique perspective on moments like these. I held public office for 20 years, was on a ballot for 25 and, before that, spent 25 years as a journalist, when most journalists believed in objectivity and readers relied on straight-fact information. My degree is in political science.

I've held office on both sides of the aisle. I've spoken at a George W. Bush rally in Dearborn at Ford Field (introduced Bo Derek, in fact) and been acknowledged from the podium by Barack Obama during a speech at Henry Ford Museum. In partisan terms, I think this qualifies me as a moderate.

My message is not necessarily optimistic: We need to wake up from this nightmare that is our current state of politics, before there's no turning back and our divisions make this country into something it never has been before. Not for our sakes, but for our children and grandchildren.

How did we get here? I believe social media has much to do with it, along with a 24-hour news cycle and news "sources," from cable TV to blogs and YouTube, that have literally created alternate realities. Half of us cannot fathom why the other half believes what it does. That goes both ways, and it is cemented. Hopefully, that cement is not yet dry and we can break free before we are permanently stuck.

In 2020, I jumped into a classmate's Facebook discussion on a matter involving presidential politics. I thought my comments and facts offered were measured, respectful, non-threatening and would provoke thoughtful discussion. I was surprised at, and offended by the vitriol in the responses. I withdrew from that and most other discussions and blocked some friends and classmates on social media.

Fast forward four years, things have gotten worse. Some classmates still start their day by posting memes or sharing links that demean "the other side" from whichever side they're on, as if we are enemies at war. Which, I hope we all realize, we are not.

Our government was established to allow for vast differences in opinions and interest, with a system to reach consensus for the common good. Because, as many politicians point out, we have more in common than what sets us apart. We are all Americans. When either side speaks of taking "our" country back, I wonder, from whom? This country is all of ours, left, right and center, and the point of our American experiment is for all to coexist and move forward.

Hope is not lost. The classmates whose vitriol I felt in 2020 were at our 50-year reunion last year, and I was so glad to see them, embraced them warmly and wished them well – despite knowing of our deep political differences.

Maybe we've been taken by surprise by the new means of news and communication, tend to react emotionally and perhaps initially lost sight of those things that hold us together. Maybe now, we all can realize we are not right-left, Dems-GOP, but, in a sense, the same people who grew up together 50-60 years ago, when we really didn't give a darn about any of these things.

So, let's all vote on Tuesday, if you haven't already voted early. Let's feel our joy or sorrow at the result, and move on from there, and – my key advice – step away from all this addictive anger. If we do not, it may well, at some point, destroy this fragile system of government and the society it has held together for a couple centuries.

Trump or Harris, Harris or Trump – it doesn't matter, we are, ALL of us, good Americans, patriotic Americans, Americans who love our country. And let's not allow our politics to cause us to lose sight of our affection for each other as well."
